Overview

The American Academy of Implant Dentistry Annual Meeting will be held at the Boston Marriott Copley Place in Boston, Massachusetts October 20-23, 2010. This dynamic meeting will feature more than thirty noted authorities in implant dentistry. Poster Presentations, Table Clinics and Graduate Student Abstracts will be an important part of this meeting and an ideal opportunity for dental professionals and graduate students to participate.

We will accept applications for Posters, Table Clinics and Abstracts until we reach capacity, so the sooner we receive your application, the better. We will contact applicants within a month of receipt of the application to verify acceptance **provided your application is complete and legible**. We will send confirmations and more precise information closer to the meeting.

Meeting Registration

Full time dental students who are Poster Presenters, Table Clinic Presenters and Abstract Presenters are eligible for complimentary meeting registration. Students are responsible for their own housing and all other expenses connected with attending the meeting.

Non-students presenters: Poster Presenters and Table Clinic Presenters who are not full time dental students must register to attend the meeting and are responsible for their own housing and all other expenses connected with attending the meeting.

POSTER PRESENTATIONS

- Dental students and practitioners are eligible to present a poster.
- Posters Presentations will be on display Thursday, October 21 through Saturday, October 23. A panel of judges will evaluate each Poster Presentation; first, second and third place winners will receive cash prizes.
- AAID will supply the tack (poster) board and pushpins.
- Poster Presentations are typically a report of research or an innovative approach. Poster Session presenters place materials such as pictures, data, graphs, diagrams and narrative text on a 8' long x 4' high tack board. Presenters are welcome to provide handouts, at their own expense, to supplement the poster.
- The poster can be assembled Thursday, October 21 early enough in the morning to be ready for display at the first refreshment break. The poster can be removed on Saturday morning between 11:00 am – 1:00 pm. Any poster not removed by 1:00 pm will be discarded. Poster Presenters will be assigned a poster location a few weeks before the meeting.

TABLE CLINICS

- Dental students and practitioners are eligible to present a Table Clinic.
- A Table Clinic consists of a ten-minute presentation supported by information on the presenter's laptop computer. The audience stands around the table to hear the presenter. It is important that the presentation be limited to ten minutes so that the audience members can hear as many presentations as possible.
- AAID will provide a small, high table on which the presenter may place a laptop. Table Clinic presenters must bring their own laptops. Because of the danger of audience members tripping on unsecured power cords, we cannot guarantee that we can provide electrical hookup so please be prepared for your laptop to use battery power.
- Table Clinics will be offered during the 60-minute refreshment breaks on Friday, October 22. Presenters will be notified of the specific time a few weeks prior to the meeting. First, second and third-place Table Clinics will receive cash prizes.

GRADUATE STUDENT ABSTRACTS

- Only graduate dental students are eligible to present an abstract.
- Graduate Student Abstracts will be presented on the morning of Saturday, October 23. The Annual Meeting Planning Committee will assign the specific time of the lecture.
- Abstracts consist of a 15-20-minute best case presentation and must involve implants.
- AAID will provide an LCD projector, screen and microphone in the presentation room.
- Cash awards will be given for the top three presentations.
